Phakamani Young Minds Academy

PYMA is a youth led organisation providing afterschool support to learners throughout their school years. Support includes: mentorship, tutoring, life skills, exam preparation and for school leavers support with tertiary applications.



Visit September 2022:

- Training on website and how to use forms we built for PYMA
- Classroom visit and meet the new interns
- Project planning for 2023
- Career guidance session

Sawabona Africa Classroom:

- Our classroom is always full
- We enabled PYMA to separate high school and junior school tutoring sessions
- Urgent need for more classrooms to accommodate all learners
- Sadly theft of the air-conditioning unit and cables



Other information:

- A long waiting list to join the academy
- Not enough space to accommodate learners
- Land issue: PYMA will stay on their land until further notice
- Urgent need of funding
- 4 interns onboarded

Phakamani Young Minds Academy

In 2022 we raised funds for 3 PYMA projects.



Raise funds for a 2nd Sawabona Africa classroom. Not sufficient space for all learners and to support expansion of programme.

Fundraising to continue into 2023

Support PYMA tutor costs. We cover some of the stipend costs tutors receive.



Raise funds to implement a maths and science for programme for girls in collaboration with EOS.

Bright Start Education and Support Programme

Bright Start provides 33 children from the townships surrounding Hout Bay, Cape Town with a education sponsorship to attend a premium school. Learners receive mentorship, guidance, medical care, holiday and afterschool programmes and have access to computers and additional support with their studies. All sponsors receive quarterly reports, reflections on their grades and a thank you letter from their sponsored child.



Visit September 2022:

- Met our sponsored children and staff and encouraged students to do their best
- The office is small but very well managed
- Learners have access to laptops to help with learning and homework

- Wafeeqah starts her final year of high school in 2023

In 2022 our continued focus was on broadening our sponsorship base of more children on the Bright Start programme. Our main campaigns were:



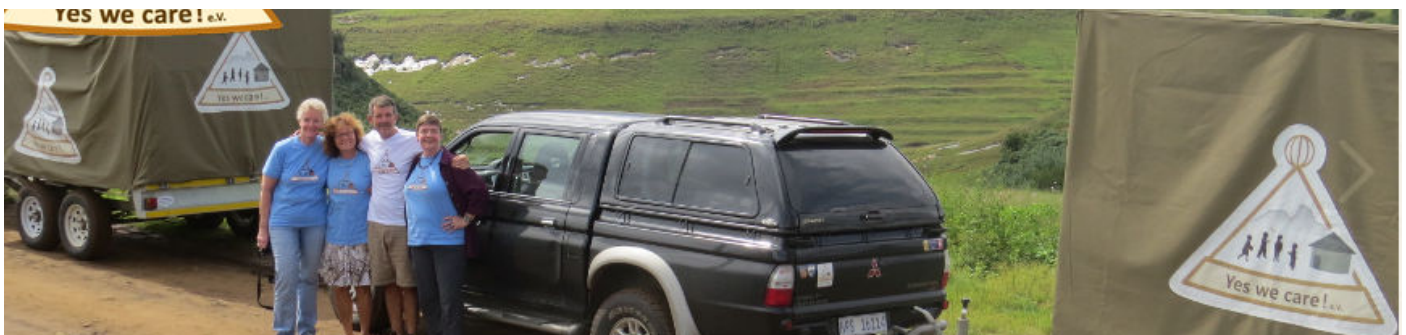
Qama is part sponsored. We would love to cover her high school costs and help her reach her goal of attending university to become a Psychologist.

Help Lesotho

Help Lesotho delivers life skills training and mental health support in rural Lesotho. AIDS decimated a generation – Help Lesotho supports those who remain move on and create lasting change in their communities. Our specific focus is on supporting children attend High School which is unaffordable for most rural families.



From Yes We Care e.V. to Sawabona Africa:

With the closing of Yes we Care e.v. (YWC) we onboarded Help Lesotho in 2022. Help Lesotho managed the Leadership Camp for all YWC learners.

Our goal is to continue the incredible work of YWC in supporting children attend high school through the Help Lesotho child sponsorship programme.

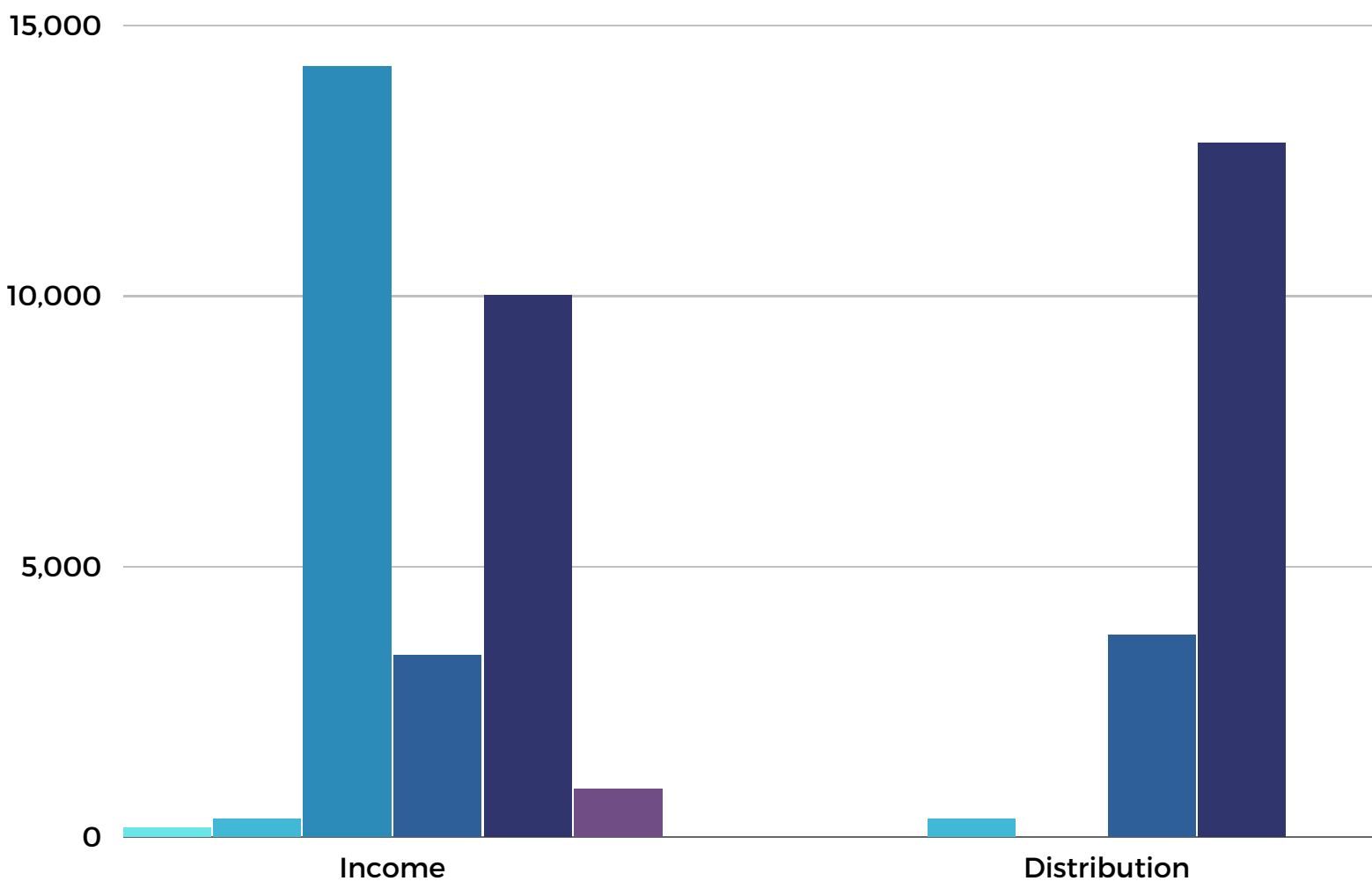
